Since the 1969 fall issue more than 200 articles, and other professional related information, have appeared in the 24 issues of the KJC. For purposes of research and information dissemination, there is a need to provide a comprehensive, updated index to the KJC. The following is designed to fill this need by incorporating the volumes from 1969 to 1980 with the volumes from 1981 to 2005.

As in the last index (published in Volume VIII, 1980), this index is divided into three parts. Part I, table of contents, provides a chronological listing of every article from the fall of 1969 issue to date. Part II, index of subjects, the articles are divided into ten categories. These categories were determined after consulting the interests groups listed in the KACA constitution and the "suggestions to contributors" section in the fall 1980 issue of the KJC. Part III, list of contributors, is an alphabetical listing of the contributors.

From 1969 to 1987, the journal was known as the *Kentucky Journal of Communication Arts*. After a 1994 organizational meeting to reinstitute the journal (there were no issues produced in 1978, 1979 and 1986 and from 1988 to 1995) the journal was renamed *Kentucky Journal of Communication*.
